FWR-Plus Form

FIRST WRITING REQUIREMENT

GUIDELINES FOR FWR+ TRACK PLACEMENT

To qualify for First Writing Requirement FWR+ track placement the following guidelines must be satisfied:

The student:

- Must have enrolled as a first-year in the Fall of 2017 or later;
- Must have scored
 - 750 or above on the SAT's Evidence-Based Reading and Writing test
 - Or a 36 on the ACT English test
 - Or qualified for FWR+ track placement by portfolio review.

The course must be *either*:

- a 2000-level ENGL course
- or a 2000-level ENCW course.

In order to fulfill the FWR with such a course, a student must earn a grade of C- or better in the course. Courses taken for a Credit (CR) or Satisfactory (S) grade will not fulfill the FWR.*

*except in semesters, like Spring 2020, when the College of Arts & Sciences modifies normal grading options in the face of extenuating circumstances.
